The Albion Bolton Agriculture Society nominated the following:

Tom Carberry has been a long-time volunteer with more than 20 years of service. Tom is always there when needed; he is huge supporter of the fair ambassador program and of the 4-H Ontario program.

Jane Ferguson contributed more than 20 years of service as president and chairperson of the Sheep Show. Jane always ensured smooth set-up and take down of events. In the past, Jane has been in charge of the society's concessions and vendors.

Lisa Hutchinson for the past five years has assisted with many aspects of the Tractor pull, Fall Fair, Baby Show, craft exhibition and parade events. Lisa was the first Junior Fair Ambassador in 2004.

Marion Kolb has been a

dedicated volunteer for more than 20 years contributing her time and efforts to a variety of the society's committees. Oxford Learning Centre.
