### High Miler of the Week

## Warrant for Caledon man

Monday, May 15 at approximately 9 p.m. Caledon H.E.A.T. team officers assisted members from the OPP Drug Enforcement Section (DES) and officers from Canada Border Service Agency in executing a search warrant on a Caledon residence.

Officers entered a Stephen Drive residence in Bolton and seized cocaine worth an estimated street value of \$46,000 along with two handguns.

An arrest warrant was issued 22-year-old John Derek Budge of Caledon. The charges include:

Possession of Cocaine; Possession for the Purpose - Cocaine; Unauthorized Possession of a Firearm (2 counts); Breach of Firearms (2 counts).

A female in her 20s was in the residence at the time, however, she was not arrested and is not facing charges.

As of late Friday, Budge had not been apprehended.

## Bolton man arrested in two York area robberies

Good work and a quick response by uniform officers and the York Regional Police helicopter Air2, to a recent weekend robbery resulted in the arrest of five men after they attempted to rob one business and were successful in robbing a second in the Town of Richmond Hill.

Saturday, May 15 at approximately 12:15 a.m., five suspects entered the Petro Canada gas station located at 12871 Yonge Street in the Town of Richmond Hill with bandanas covering their faces. One of the men produced a handgun and demanded cash and property from the victim. The victim complied and the suspects fled west on King Road in a vehicle with a quantity of cash and cigarettes. As they fled the victim and an astute witness were able to obtain the licence plate of the vehicle they were in and immediately provide it to police.

A short time later a keen officer spotted the vehicle on the southbound on-ramp to Highway 400 from Major Mackenzie Drive in the City of Vaughan. With the assistance of other officers and the York Regional Police helicopter Air2, a high-risk takedown was initiated and all five suspects were arrested without incident. All of the property stolen in the robbery was recovered.

As a result of the investigation into this robbery, it was revealed that the same suspects had earlier attempted to enter the Esso gas station located at 12985 Bathurst Street but were unsuccessful.

Charged are:

Arun Rana, 19, of Bolton; two 17-year-old youths, of Toronto, and two 16-year-old youths, of Toronto.

Charges include Robbery While Armed; Use of a Firearm in the Commission of an Offence; Point Firearm; Disguise with Intent; Attempt Robbery While Armed with a Firearm.
