Palgrave man seriously injured

The York Regional Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is investigating a serious motor vehicle collision which occurred on Dufferin Street in the City of Vaughan.

Wednesday, May 31 at approximately 9:20 p.m., a black Toyota Corolla was northbound on Dufferin Street, waiting to turn left onto Langstaff Road. The driver began to make the turn and was struck by a southbound Nissan Infinity. The collision sent both vehicles off the roadway into the southwest corner of the intersection.

The driver of the Toyota, a 57-year-old man from Palgrave, was taken to Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre in Toronto in critical condition.

The driver of the Nissan, a 30-year-old Concord woman, was taken to York Central Hospital in Richmond Hill with non-life-threatening injuries. She was treated and released.

**Transport truck
leaves accident scene**

Caledon OPP officers are investigating a two-vehicle, fail-to-remain crash that occurred on Highway 10 near Highpoint Sideroad last Tuesday.

Police report that at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday, May 30, a red transport truck that was being operated erratically collided with a blue Toyota Echo. The Toyota car left the roadway and rolled, injuring the two occupants. The truck driver, who is unknown at this stage of the investigation drove away from the scene after briefly stopping beyond the crash location.

Caledon OPP officer Jason Tardif is interviewing witnesses and is interested in speaking with anyone else who may have information concerning the red transport truck or its fleeing driver.
