The book is only one small part of the efforts,

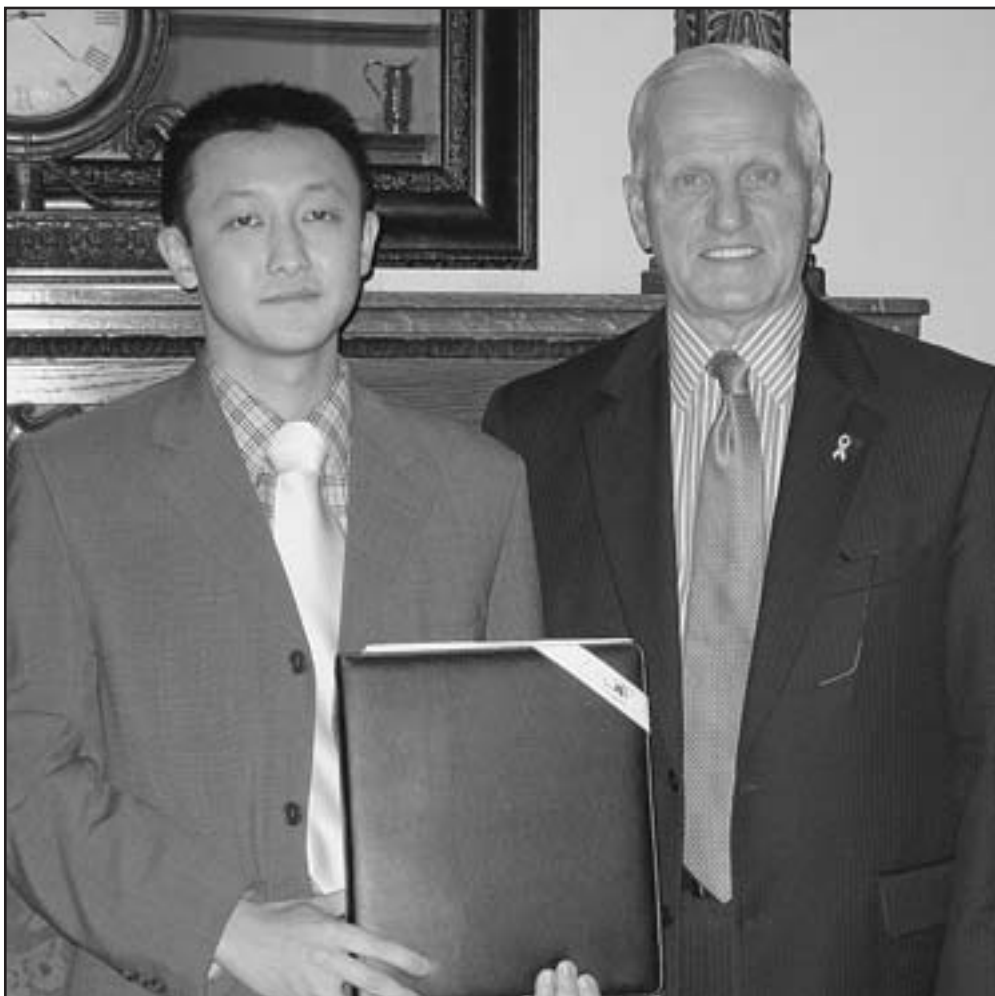
Hong noted. Many area schools got involved, and so there are several books on the go. "It really does show that our community cares!" Hong stressed.
