Humberview was ahead a goal when Jesse Fir rushed to the opposing net, and directed a beautiful pass from Bokla past the goalie to once again tie up the game. Hauck's low shot right on the ice, again from a

pass from Bokla got the win for the Hawks.

Fir received the MVP award. The possibility of being the advancing wild card team was left in the hands of another team who had to get a win. It was not to be, and the boys had to settle with the four games played.

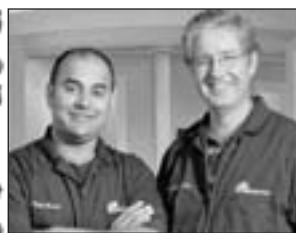
