

# Roth Hawks down Timber Wolves, split with Rangers

Roth Diamond Tools minor bantam AE Hawks hosted Waterloo Timber Wolves Saturday, Dec. 9 at the Mayfield Rec complex. Depleted by injuries and suspensions the Hawks got some much-needed help from their AP players Taylor Elkins, Warren Stroud and Michael Bellisario.

## Farmer continues hunger strike over raw milk

The issue of people's freedom to choose what kind of food they want to eat has made news across Ontario the past two weeks after an Owen Sound-area farmer had his farm shut down by the provincial government for selling raw milk.

The farmer, Michael Schmidt, began a hunger strike shortly after Ministry of Natural Resources officers raided his Glencolton Farms on Nov. 21 and seized his equipment, documents and other items. He said he will continue the strike until all of the items removed from his farm have been returned.

Selling unpasteurized milk to the public has been illegal in Ontario since 1938. The sale of raw milk is, however, permitted throughout Europe and

many American states.

"I'm not arguing the fact that raw milk is better," Schmidt said in a statement on his Web site, glencoltonfarms.com. "I know it is better. It is the cow owners' choice to drink their milk. The fight is not about me, it's not about the farm, it's about the freedom of informed choice for every individual in Ontario."

Schmidt provides food to 150 families, most of them in the Greater Toronto Area. His Web site includes testimonials from his customers about the benefits of raw milk.

In 1994 he was charged with and found guilty for selling raw milk.

"I was placed under probation for two years, meaning that I was not to produce and process any milk," he said. "During that time, I offered the government this farm as a

research facility for the production of farm fresh milk."

In 1995 he notified the provincial government of his intention to continue providing people with fresh farm milk from their own cows.

When there was no response from the government regarding his research offer, he announced he would conduct his own research independently and if the farm were subjected to any more raids and interference he would go on a hunger strike.

Bruce-Grey-Owen Sound MPP Bill Murdoch will introduce a private member's bill in the Ontario legislature tomorrow (Dec. 7) proposing an all-party task force be created to examine whether the ban should be lifted on selling unpasteurized milk.

# The Monster is Loose!

The monster is definitely loose, and that beast is flying high through the blood-red sky.

The Halloween release of Meat Loaf's *Bat Out of Hell III: The Monster is Loose*, comes as good news fans of Meat and his style of honest rock. Music lovers can enjoy the sounds of Meat in this third and likely final, installment of what has become an epic rock legacy.

This was an ambitious project, spanning more than a decade, to bring it to fruition. The album also reunites Meat and lyric genius Jim Steinman, who, along with *Bat Out of Hell* veteran Todd Rundgren, combine to bring us a fresh, but distinct Meat Loaf sound. The album was produced by Desmond Child and mixed by Grammy winning engineer Greg Collins. Studio guests on this include Motley Crue bassist Nikki Sixx and Rob Zombie guitarist John 5. The guitar work of Steve Vai is also quite something.

Included is *Bad for Good*, from Steinman's 1981 solo album of the same name. The new track features a very cool guitar solo by Queen's Brian May. In similar operatic rock style, Steinman's album *Bad for Good* would complement any Meat Loaf fan's music library.

Also in keeping with tradition, three songs feature female artists - Marion Raven on the song made famous by Celine Dion, *It's All Coming Back to Me Now*; Patti Russo on *What About Love*, and Jennifer Hudson on *The Future Ain't What is Used to Be*. Every heathen on the planet should play *It's All Coming Back to Me Now* at their funeral because Raven's voice would surely summon the angels.

What makes Meat Loaf transcend the generations is his combination of powerful vocals, long, detailed stories and music that makes you smile whether backed by a string orchestra or sung at a karaoke bar. The Steinman tunes are distinctly recognizable from the Child songs, making for an interesting mix.

Toronto fans enjoyed *Bat on Broadway* at the Elgin Theatre Nov. 4. Each of the show's three acts was devoted to songs in the album trilogy.

The album debuted at #3 in Canada and #8 in the U.S.

This is a must-have for fans who are now introducing their children to Meat Loaf. I only wish they still made the 12-inch vinyl picture discs!


