Hawks 1, Snipers 1

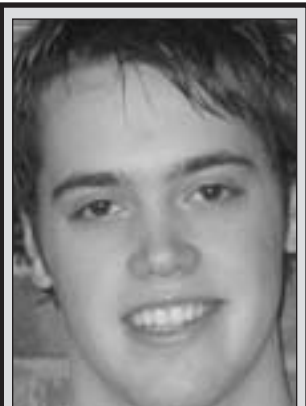
Nov. 12 saw the Hawks again travelling into enemy territory as they were pitted against the Brampton Snipers that resulted in a 1-1 tie.

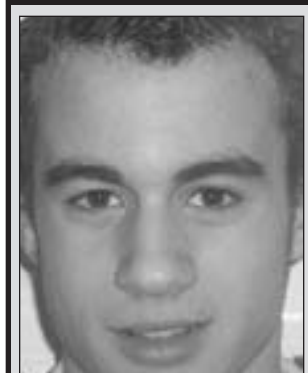


Paul Mearns Maverick of the Week
