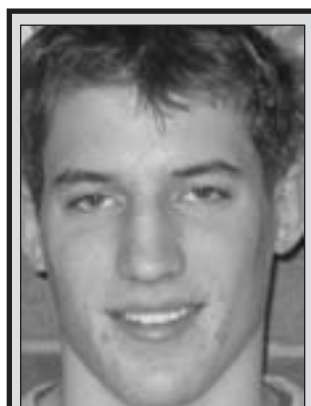
Hawks up by two
