scoring with a nice shot, assists to Pleasance and Kitson. Hawk player of the game with 3 goals and an assist was J Stronach.

Mayfield was the site for game 2 and the Hawks were looking to take control early again. Wilson put this plan into action from Carter Ledson and K Kitson. The Hawks plan was working until Georgetown put in two goals off of deflections and they gained confidence.

Georgetown pulled further ahead in the second and the Hawks found themselves two goals down. Before the end of the second, Simonetta closed the gap to 3 to 2, assists for Ledson and Wilson. The Hawks pressed hard in the third for the tying goal but were denied, even on a buzzer-ending scramble.
