### Youth killed in collision

Caledon OPP and emergency service personnel responded to a single motor vehicle collision on Horseshoe Road, north of Beech Grove Side Road Monday, March 19, just before 3 p.m.

A red Mazda was northbound on Horseshoe Hills Road when the driver lost control of the vehicle causing it to leave the roadway. The vehicle came to a rest in the east side ditch after striking a tree.

Tragically, the driver, 18-year-old Peter Coyne of Caledon did not survive and was pronounced at the scene of the collision. A 16-year-old male passenger received minor injuries but was not transported to hospital.

OPP Technical Collision Investigators were on scene and the road was closed for several hours while they conducted their investigation.

### House fire on second floor

Saturday, March 17 at approximately 10:20 a.m., Caledon Fire & Emergency Services responded to a report of a house fire received from a 911 call.

The caller reported he saw smoke coming from the house and was unsure if there was anyone home. Upon arrival, at 17717 Regional Road 50, fire crews found advanced fire conditions showing from the second floor bedroom of the two-storey house and requested addition apparatus.

Crews commenced a defensive fire attack from the exterior until such time the fire was contained sufficiently to allow crews to enter for a search and interior attack on the fire.

A primary and secondary search was completed and it was also confirmed by the owner that all occupants were accounted for and were not home at the time of the fire.

The fire damage was extensive on the second floor and roof due to the advanced fire conditions prior to the fire crews arriving.

There were no injuries.

The cause is under investigation and damage is estimated at \$150,000.

Agencies responding included Palgrave, Mono Mills, Caledon East, and Bolton fire stations, Caledon OPP, Peel EMS and Electrical Safety Authority.

The Policing Advisory Council of Caledon is playing an effective role in making the community a safer place to live.

Caledon council praised the work of PACC following a presentation made by its chair, Kevin Junor.

He provided an overview of PACC's mission and the benefits it provides to the Town and Caledon OPP.

Its role is to help identify community and individual concerns regarding public safety and develop solutions in partnership with the Town and OPP.

Joining Junor on the PACC executive for 2006 to 2008 are vice-chair Terry Fast, secretary Jackie Flynn, treasurer Ian Ford, directors Jane Clarke and Lina Lawrence, councillors Richard Paterak and Jason Payne, police representative Sergeant Nikki Randall and past chair Garry Moore.

Junor noted PACC has successfully engaged the Town on park safety, road safety improvements and safety awareness. The committee also acts as a communication channel that streamlines residents' concerns to a core body of knowledgeable people with access to the right resources.

He added PACC is also the liaison between the police and the community. The committee saves the police time and other resources. It works closely with the OPP to resolve issues within its community.

PACC identifies traffic-related issues primarily through community input. It provides recommendations to the decision makers who would deal with a specific issue.

Junor said their Road Watch subcommittee has been most productive. Road Watch's mandate is to influence the reduction of automobile collisions and fatalities through awareness education. Online citizen report forms are available at www.roadwatch.ca.

PACC is also involved with the OPP's restorative justice program.

"The restorative justice is a great program," said Councillor Annette Groves.

She added these criminals aren't going to be punished for life, but they will realize their wrongdoing.

Mayor Marolyn Morrison said Junor and the committee have done an outstanding job.
