Caledon Lightning bantam select team takes 'triple crown'

for a great performance in net.

The championship game of the tournament was set for Bolton arena on Sunday afternoon, a re-match between the Lightning and the Oakville Hitmen. The action started early as Dylan Stafford found the back of the net after a nice lead pass from West-Carvalho.
