U.S.-based Cambria opens \$4 million operation in Bolton

Cambria, the only producer of natural quartz surfaces in the United States, is opening a state-of-the-art operation in Bolton.

The 68,000-square-foot facility will manufacture a variety of surfaces including countertops, shower and tub surrounds, vanities, flooring, fireplace surrounds, desk tops and window sills for residential and commercial use. The company will initially hire 75 new employees for the operation.

"Cambria is actually made from natural quartz that is mined right here in Canada and because it is further processed in Ontario, it is a genuine locally-made product," said Peter Martin, vice-president of marketing for Cambria. "The housing market as well as the strong local economy made Ontario an ideal location for our \$4 million new fabrication facility."

Cambria was recently ranked #4 on *Entrepreneur* magazine's list of the 500 fastest growing U.S. companies. Headquartered in Le Sueur, Minnesota, the company's products are available through builders, designers/architects and kitchen/bath retailers throughout all of North America and portions of Canada.

To celebrate the grand opening of the new facility, Cambria enlisted the help of legendary Canadian rocker Ronnie Hawkins who performed in an outdoor concert setting at the Bolton facility Aug. 18.

"We are excited to be opening major operations in

Canada," said Cambria CEO and president Marty Davis. "I am also excited that my good friend Ronnie Hawkins, a Canadian and international rock legend, is partnering with us to help introduce a new kind of rock to the Ontario marketplace."

In addition to being named as one of the fastest growing companies in the U.S., Cambria has also been recognized for its food safety and environmental standards. The stone is certified by National Sanitation Foundation (NSF) International since there is no safer surface for food preparation available to consumers. The product is also environmentally-friendly to manufacture and is recognized Greenguard Indoor Air Quality, as a low-emitting type of building material. Town will store buses

Caledon council recently reached a licence agreement with GO Transit for the temporary storage of buses at the Castleberg public works yard.

Go Transit approached the Town regarding a temporary location to store its buses when they are not in use, until a more permanent site is secured.

The agreement runs from Sept. 1, 2007, to March 31, 2008. The agreement is subject to a one-year renewal from April 1, 2008, to March 31, 2009.

GO Transit will pay the Town a monthly licence fee of \$3,000 plus applicable taxes.

The \$21,000 in revenue the Town will receive over the seven-month agreement will be allocated to the public works miscellaneous revenue account.
