Armed robbery at Bolton gas bar

At approximately 3:45 a.m. Tuesday, Sept. 4, two male suspects entered a service station on Queen Street South in Bolton. One of the suspects was brandishing a weapon. The attendant was not injured during the robbery and the quantity of cash and merchandise taken is unknown at this time.

Both suspects are described as white males, wearing black hooded sweatshirts and blue jeans with their faces covered by a cloth material.

The suspects fled on foot in an unknown direction.

HAZMAT and PERT officers respond to suspicious letter

Tuesday, Sept. 4, at approximately 12:20 p.m., Caledon OPP officers responded to a call of a suspicious letter received in the mail by a Royal Valley Drive homeowner in Caledon.

The letter was threatening in nature and contained an unknown substance.

HAZMAT units from Brampton Fire as well as officers from the OPP Provincial Emergency

Response Team (PERT) were called to the scene.

Caledon OPP closed Royal Valley Drive between Pinebrook Circle and Valleywood Drive for the purpose of the investigation. The roadway reopened at 4:15 p.m.

The involved home as well as three homes nearby were evacuated as a safety precaution.

It was determined that the

substance did not possess any safety risk.

Caledon Major Crime Unit will be continuing the investigation.

Police find grow-op, weapons at house

Wednesday, Sept. 5, at roughly 12 p.m., Caledon OPP officers were assisting a financial institution with the repossession of a residence on Old Highway 9 in Caledon.

Upon arriving at the residence, officers observed evidence of a small marijuana grow operation. Caledon OPP Major Crime Unit detectives were notified. The home was searched and two long guns as well as a small explosive device were seized.

OPP Provincial Emergency Response Team officers (PERT) were called in to assist with the search of the residence and disposal of the explosive device.

No arrests have been made at this time, however, the investigation is on going.

Caledon OPP would like to reassure residents in the area that there is no safety concerns for the public at this time.
