

Alpha for Youth program now available in west Caledon area

Tweens and teens in the communities of Terra Cotta, west Caledon and Glen Williams will have an exciting new opportunity to explore Christianity and the meaning of life at an upcoming Alpha for Youth program, being offered by Union Presbyterian Church.

program is a spin-off from the popular Alpha Course, which was first devised at Holy Trinity Brompton, London, England and has enjoyed global popularity, now boasting about 24,000 completed courses worldwide.

course leaders began to search for ways to present the materials in a way that would appeal to and attract a younger audience. With this goal in mind, Alpha for Youth was born.

Like the original Alpha course, Alpha for Youth is a 10-week practical exploration of the Christian

faith, designed primarily for non-church goers and new Christians.

While videos are an integral part of the adult Alpha course, they are not included in the specially-designed youth curriculum, which instead focuses on presentations that are both more interactive and faster paced.

Alpha for Youth is a bold new undertaking for the congregation of the Union Presbyterian Church, which will celebrate its 175th anniversary this spring, and

they invite all area youth from Grade 7 through high school to participate.

"This will be an exciting opportunity for our youth to explore Christianity and its meaning," commented David Thompson, an elder at Union Presbyterian Church and the team leader for this new youth project.

The program begins next Saturday (Feb. 23) at Union Presbyterian Church, 16789 22nd Sideroad (near the corner of Winston Churchill Boulevard and Old School Road) and will run for 10

consecutive Saturday morning sessions, from 9:30 until 11:30 a.m. Each session will begin with a hot, hearty, family-style breakfast with discussion groups to follow.

Nominations open for Caledon's Environmentalist of the Year for 2008

The Caledon Environmental Advisory Committee (CEAC) is seeking nominations from the public for the 2008 Environmentalist of the Year Award.

The due date for nominations is March 14.

"CEAC's Environmentalist of the Year award encourages environmental stewardship across Caledon and provides recognition for outstanding community efforts," said Mayor Marolyn Morrison.

CEAC grants the award to a Caledon resident, business or organization that has made a significant effort to protect, enhance or restore the natural heritage of Caledon. The Environmentalist of the Year

receives a certificate at the Town of Caledon's annual Volunteer and Citizen Achievement Awards event in April. Their name is also added to the commemorative rock in the CEAC Stewardship Grove on the Trans-Canada Trail in Caledon East.

The Environmentalist of the Year has the honour of directing a \$500 Annual Environmentalism Recognition Award (AERA) to a Caledon-based environmental stewardship project. The 2007 Environmentalist of the Year, the late John Gilbert, directed the AERA to the Caledon Countryside Alliance's Eat Local initiative.

Since the program commenced, the Environmentalists of the Year have been John Gilbert (2007), Bolton and District Horticultural Society (2006), Humber Valley Heritage Trail Association (2005), Nicola Ross (2004), Linda Pim (2003), Dave Smith (2002), Steven Waring (2001), Healthy Lawns Healthy People (2000), William Sheard (1999), Richard Ehrlich (1998) and

Robert Schad (1997).

Nominees for the award must meet the following criteria:

- Must be one of: a Caledon resident, a Caledon-based organization or own/work in a Caledon business.
- Have contributed to the protection and improvement of the environment in Caledon.
- Have promoted innovative approaches to the sustainable use and management of natural resources.
- Have demonstrated a long-standing commitment to the health of the environment.
- Be an active volunteer and/or leader in community environmental initiatives.
- Be a community environmental "hero."

Nominations must include the nominee's name, address and phone number, a description of their achievements, and how they meet the criteria.
