North hill lands could be used for other development

Consultants have named their preferred location for a new supermarket for Bolton's north hill, but the owners of other properties that were in the running are still hoping to do something with their lands.

And at least one Caledon councillor is taking the idea seriously.

Planning consultant David Butler, who's heading up the technical team looking into the issue, announced last month that the lands at the northeast corner of Highway 50 and Columbia Way would be the preferred spot for the supermarket. Lands on the other side of 50 had been considered too. Planning consultant Paul King, representing Caledon Garden
