No injuries in fire in Bolton

Caledon Fire and Emergency Services estimates some \$60,000 in damage was caused last Sunday after a fire broke out at a home on Royal Terrace Crescent in the Bolton.

The alarm was reported at 11:14 a.m., and crews found heavy smoke and flame in the rear portion of the garage when they arrived. They conducted a primary search of the home and checked for fire extension, while a second fire crew commenced an offensive fire attack and quickly put it out.

Fire damage was limited to the garage, but there was minor smoke damage in remainder of the home. Crews remained on scene for an additional 90 minutes to conduct overhaul and assist with fire cause determination.

The owners of the house

had just arrived home and noticed the power was out. They saw smoke emanating from the garage, and quickly evacuated the home, with the assistance of an off-duty fire-

fighter, and called 9-1-1 from a safe location.

There were no injuries and the cause of the fire has been listed as electrical failure.

Numerous charges in domestic incident

Caledon OPP reports they were called out to a business address in Bolton last Monday regarding a possible domestic incident.

Upon arrival early in the afternoon, police determined the former boyfriend of one of the employees of the business had left before they arrived.

A 29-year-old man from Caledon was subsequently charged with numerous charges related to recent and

previous domestic abuse.

The charges include assault causing bodily harm; three counts of assault; overcoming resistance to commit an indictable offence; uttering threats to cause death; five counts of failing to comply with recognizance; breach of a probation order; driving while disqualified; possession, use, trafficking credit cards; and possession of marijuana (less than 30 grams).

The female victim in this incident sustained minor injuries.

Serious injuries in accident last Saturday

A 35-year-old Richmond Hill resident was air lifted

to Sunnybrook hospital with life-threatening injuries last Saturday after a single-vehicle accident on Torbram Road, south of King Street.

Caledon OPP reports a blue Dodge Neon was heading north at about 10:20 p.m. when it apparently crossed the road and hit a hydro pole in the west ditch, and then struck a large rock.

Torbram was closed for

about five hours between Old School Road and King Street, and some area residents lost their power for a while because of downed lines.
