Whitehead ready to run again

Caledon's most senior councillor wants another term added to his record.

Richard Whitehead, who is completing his 21st year holding elected office in Caledon, has registered to seek another term as regional representative for Wards 3

and 4.

He cited his years of involvement in the community, stating he's been there at every turn of the path for the Town. Whitehead added a lot of important work has been done that helps set strategies for how to deal with the future. But these changes,

such as the passage of Regional Official Plan Amendment (ROPA) 24 now has to be implemented. They have to come up with a strategy to do that.

Whitehead added municipal finances are in good shape, with reserves being built back up. As well, he

said there's been progress in getting industrial and commercial tax assessments up. They have increased from about 10 to 17 per cent, but he said the aim is to get it up to about 30.

He had also called for the establishment of an economic development committee. "The work of that committee is just starting," he said.

Whitehead said his experience will be useful in the coming campaign, as he views his chances in the election as good.

He observed that's he was a little late to file his nomination papers, and had a number of people calling him, urging him to run.

"I found that reassuring," he said. "I always run elections on the assumption that I'm one vote behind."
