Jobs Caledon features careers in the trades

Jobs Caledon in Bolton will be hosting a presentation on apprenticeships Nov. 24.

It will be given by Shane McCarthy, training director of the Joint Training and Apprenticeship Committee (JTAC) at the Local 787/Ontario Refrigeration and Air Conditioning (ORAC) Training Centre.

The presentation will run from 1 to 3 p.m.

McCarthy will be discussing the mechanical construction trades, like air conditioning and refrigeration, plumbing, pipe fitting, steam fitting, sprinkler fitting, electrical and sheet-metal trades, as well as providing information about pre-apprenticeships and apprenticeship programs.

"A skilled trade is as simple as a pen maker, (but) what people really want to know and talk about are apprenticeship trades," he said, "careers in trades through apprenticeships."

"Apprenticeship basically means that you're going to be indentured to an employer and the employer will have you work with a skilled craftsman, and that skilled craftsman will mentor you during your apprenticeship," he added, "it is all

about learning from the master craftsman."

For people interested in the skilled trades and apprenticeship, this is an excellent opportunity to speak directly to someone who has been involved in the field for more than 25 years.

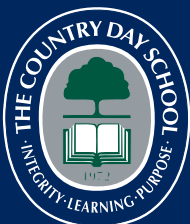
